- (New clay is \$1.50/lb and reclaim is \$1.00/lb. and sold in 5 lb. blocks). \*No outside clay permitted in the studio-must purchase clay in-house.
- Three electric oxidation kilns, CFAC staff fires kilns.
- Lockers are assigned on a first come, first served basis, and must be cleaned out by the end of the semester.
