INTRODUCTION

Our University is dedicated to fostering a caring and safe community. Every student has a right to an education that is free from discrimination, and Penn State is committed to ensuring that all students have the opportunity to fully benefit from the University's programs and activities. Sexual violence, sexual harassment, stalking, and intimate partner violence can interfere with a student's academic performance and emotional and physical well-being. Preventing and remedying sexual misconduct at Penn State are essential to ensuring a safe environment in which our students can learn.
