

CERAMICS STUDIO MEMBERSHIPS

*Semester Fees: \$85 for PSU students, with valid PSU Student ID

Memberships are available for the experienced potter! Must have throwing and glazing skills. Use of Ceramics Studio and equipment available during posted membership hours beginning January 27 - April 25, 2025. *Prices subject to change.

- Eight electric wheels and wedging tables.
- Memberships are for wheel throwing ONLY
- Use of house glazes and free firing of pieces*.
- New and reclaimed porcelain clay for sale- members must purchase clay from the studio
- (New clay is \$1.50/lb and reclaim is \$1.00/lb. and sold in 5 lb. blocks). *No outside clay permitted in the studio-must purchase clay in-house.
- Three electric oxidation kilns, CFAC staff fires kilns.
- Lockers are assigned on a first come, first served basis, and must be cleaned out by the end of the semester.

Ceramics Memberships are meant to foster a sense of community and we ask that work is created in the studio.

Additional firing fees may be applied if exceptionally tall/large pieces that take up extra kiln space or larger quantities of work are produced




